Hinged foam core cut out doors by DG covered in red & black duct tape used for Private Lives of Dancers, 2002 - re-used for Dancing Henry Five - 2004-07 cut down & re-used - for Aristophanes in Birdonia - 2006 Black & White - black & red diagonally striped cloths designed & painted by Power Boothe - for Trying Times - 1982 -3 black & white cloths dyed grey - re-used for Dancing Henry Five - 2004

Many of these objects are re-used in multiple productions - and - used in Pick Up Performance Co(s)'s tours of *Dancing Henry Five* from 2004 to 2011. This pileup echoes the original pileup - remembered by stage manager Ed Fitzgerald - for *DH5* opening scene @ Danspace in NY - 2004.

Objects -

2 sided & 3 dimensional - rolling staircase - Fannie's coffin - frame - clock - television console - and - DG's parents Rose and Sam watching television - Rose & Sam's dinner table - chess table and drinks table - Statue of Liberty - letter to Marcel Duchamp - baby carriage - couple - child - pair of shoe boxes - rolling doorframe built originally for 1st wkshp - by Guthrie Theater crew @ DG request - black metal folding chairs w/stenciled R. Mutt - refer to Duchamp's R. Mutt signature on *Fountain*, 1917 - painted by PUPCos staff -

DG's original black felt-tip marker drawings - on his white foam core cut outs - are used for Mysteries workshops -1989 to 90 - prior to production - and - serve as casual blueprint - for Red Grooms sets - and 2 and 3 dimensional objects.

Red Grooms sets and objects used for National tour - 1990 - 1993 - for Obie winner - *The Mysteries and What's So Funny?*

PILE UP - Trying Times - 1982


