SCOTT CUNNINGHAM *Performer*

Scott Cunningham has been a performer in many of David Gordon's works since 1986; *The United States, The Mysteries and What's So Funny?, Shelimiel the First, Punch and Judy get Divorced,* and *Private Lives of the Dancers*. He moved to New York from Needham, MA in 1984, and danced in the premieres of dances by the Mark Morris Dance Group and Elisa Monte at BAM that same year. He has performed in the dances of Ohad Naharin and Sondra Loring and has presented his own choreography at Judson Church and DanceSpace. He has taught Dance and Contact Improvisation workshops all over the U.S.A. and in 2008 earned a Master's of Education from Bank Street College. He has been a student of Pilates with Nathaniel Lee since 2006.

ALYCE DISSETTE *Producer*

Alyce Dissette has worked on more than 70 productions and projects with internationally known performing, visual, film, and digital artists in a wide range of venues from staff member in the Metropolitan Opera presentations department to former executive producer of the PBS national TV series *Alive From Off Center/AliveTV*. She was director of one of the first international digital art works competitions New Voices, New Visions sponsored by Paul Allen, the Voyager Co., and *WIRED* magazine presented at Lincoln Center. She currently produces the work of Ain Gordon and David Gordon and has been producing director of their Pick Up Performance Co(s) for over 10 years.

ED FITZGERALD *Stage Manager*

Ed Fitzgerald has been a professional stage manager for 42 years, working on Broadway (*Da, A Little Family Business, The Tap Dance Kid, Carrie: The Musical, The Violet Hour*), off-Broadway (Manhattan Theatre Club, *The Best of Friends, Tick, Tick...Boom*), off-off-Broadway, and in major regional theatres throughout the country (ART, ACT, Mark Taper Forum, Geffen Playhouse, BAM, Spoleto USA) and overseas (London, Berlin, Singapore, Seoul, Avignon, Strasbourg). He's been associated with David Gordon, Ain Gordon and the Pick Up Performance Co(s) for 25 years and numerous productions.

PATSY GAY *Archivist*

As an archivist, Patsy has worked with Dance Heritage Coalition, Dance Theatre of Harlem, Eiko & Koma, and Lar Lubovitch Dance Company. Patsy received her MA in American Dance Studies from Florida State University in 2011 and is currently pursuing an MSLIS at Pratt Institute.
